Availability at night and on weekends

Sometimes, you need to contact your doctor after the office has closed. Make sure you can get in touch with a member of your care team any time you have an urgent concern.



Flexibility with your support system

You may want to bring your children, loved ones or caregivers to your appointment, so they can help you make care decisions. Make sure your doctor can accommodate this.



Communication with other doctors

You may see other specialists for different health needs. Consider whether your doctor works with specialists to coordinate your care.



Focus on healthy living

As you get older, your doctor should help you learn to lead a healthy life. That might mean tips on diet, exercise, and mental health. Make sure your doctor isn't only concerned about medical needs.



Good personality

You may spend a lot of time with your doctor. You should feel comfortable and enjoy being around them!

Will the doctor's office provide options for you to get to and from your medical appointments?



Labs and tests:

Can you complete your labs and other tests in the doctor's office, or do you have to go to another location?



Same-day and walk-in appointments:

If you have an urgent need, can you get a same-day or walk-in appointment?

When making a decision about your doctor, make sure the doctor you want to see is in network with your Medicare Advantage plan. The kind of plan you choose and who you choose as your doctor makes all the difference.



Every year, during the **Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (AEP)**, from October 15 to December 7, Medicare-eligible seniors can make changes to their existing plan or enroll in Medicare Advantage. Any changes to your benefits become effective on January 1.

What is Medicare Advantage?



Medicare Advantage is another way to get your Medicare Part A and Part B coverage. They are offered by Medicare-approved private companies, and they must follow rules created by Medicare. While Original Medicare is covered by the federal government, Medicare Advantage is provided by private insurance companies. **Medicare Advantage includes all the benefits of Original Medicare, along with valuable extras such as prescription drug coverage, dental, vision, hearing, and more.**

Some Medicare Advantage Plans offer even more benefits. For instance, some plans may include coverage for services such as transportation to medical appointments, over-the-counter medications, and wellness programs. Plans may also customize their benefit packages to cater to those with chronic illnesses, providing custom benefits to address specific health issues.

Before you enroll in a plan, it's important to review the plan's offerings to determine the various available benefits, whether or not you qualify, and any potential restrictions.
